

About Tadamon

Making CSOs Stronger

The IsDB - ISFD NGO Empowerment for Poverty Reduction Program (Tadamon) is a partnership program sponsored by the Islamic Solidarity Fund for Development (ISFD), managed and designed by the Islamic Development Bank (IsDB), and implemented by the United Nations Development Programme (UNDP). This booklet demonstrates how this initiative has evolved from providing visibility to Civil Society Organizations' (CSOs) projects and activities to facilitating and supporting innovative ideas that have potential to scale up in those Member Countries (MCs) of the Organization

of Islamic Cooperation (OIC) that have endorsed the Program.

The program is being implemented during the years 2019-2024 among the 57 OIC member countries. Each year, around 7 priority countries are selected for the implementation of the program. Within the scope of the program, over 100 CSOs are empowered annually. The goal of this booklet is to illustrate the activities and achievements of the IsDB-ISFD NGO Empowerment Program for Poverty Reduction in Jordan.



Civil Society in Pakistan

In Pakistan, the civil society sector has grown tremendously over the years. The core objective of civil society remains welfare-oriented initiatives of serving humanity and uplifting vulnerable communities. Thus, they play a substantial role in community engagement and development, skill development, improving income-generation opportunities, and in turn, contributing to economic activity in the country.

Civil society exists in various social forms in the country, such as a council of elders, and neighbourhood or community associations, alongside more formalised groups registered as non-profits organisations (NPOs). These CSOs/NPOs can be registered under laws such as the Societies Registration Act, Trust Act, Voluntary Social Welfare Agencies (Registration and Control) Ordinance, and Companies Ordinance. Compliance with these laws is necessary to gain legal status and access funds from social welfare departments and other development partners.

As per the Federal Board of Revenue (FBR), the number of registered Non-Profit Organisations (NPOs) with the FBR stands at 3,184, while an additional 676 are registered with the Securities and Exchange Commission of Pakistan (SECP).

Furthermore, there are numerous unregistered NPOs operating in various provinces of Pakistan, comprising 1,548 in Balochistan, 958 in Khyber Pakhtunkhwa, 3,640 in Sindh, 7,292 in Punjab, and 55 in the Islamabad Capital Territory. These organisations engage in a wide array of activities including education, advocacy, social services, religious practices, and healthcare provision.

With a staggering count of 17,408 Non-Profit Organisations currently operating in Pakistan, it is reasonable to acknowledge the significant impact these organisations, especially the well-known ones, have in terms of job creation and income generation through their social welfare programs.

Civil Society Organizations are indeed valuable development partners that help promote citizen participation, enhance sustainability, generate jobs, and alleviate poverty to accelerate progress towards Agenda 2030. However, for a majority of Pakistan's CSOs, access to finance and capacity constraints remain one of the main challenges. This obstacle is to a large extent associated with the lack of information on different funding mechanisms, the weak quality of CSO projects, and their campaigns being inaccessible to potential donors and development partners.




Mapping of CSOs

Since 2020, the program has mapped, categorised and surveyed the civil society landscape across 33 OIC member countries. In 2021 this mapping was conducted in Somalia in order to better understand and get to know the people and organizations at the forefront of grassroots development.

Instead of relying on existing databases and directories, a new approach was specifically designed to have CSOs come to our platform. The goal was to identify the most active organizations that would benefit from the program and its activities, by having CSOs sign up on the Tadamon platform.

After signing up and passing our three-step verification process, CSOs gain access to participate in our activities: grant programs, financed by IsDB, Crowdfunding Academies and other forthcoming capacity building programs.

CSO verification

CSOs that signed up to the platform go through a threestep verification process to ensure they are eligible for the program and have an official registration with local authorities. The applications are also reviewed for any fake applications and scammers.




CSOs in Pakistan



Fields of activities of mapped CSOs




Reasons for joining Tadamon




Experience with Crowdfunding




Whether or not mapped CSOs have received previous funding from UNDP or ISDB




How organizations found out about Tadamon




SDGs that best describe the activities of mapped CSOs



As a result of CSO mapping, TADAMON now has a searchable database of over 3419 CSOs categorized by a number of variables. In this way, interested partners can search for organizations working on specific development challenges.

In 2020 we started with six pilot countries, in which to test our approach and refine our services. Each year we are expanding our network to new OIC member countries that have endorsed the Tadamon program.
